Purpose: to strengthen the bonds of friendship between Kyudo practitioners throughout the Baltic Sea countries.

Teachers: Feliks F. Hoff (Kyoshi 6.Dan) and Connie Brandl-Hoff (Renshi 5.Dan).

Participants: kyujin from the Baltic Sea countries: Denmark, Estonia, Finland, Germany, Latvia, Lithuania, Norway, Poland, Russia and Sweden.

Kyudo seminar

Friday (October 18) and Sunday (October 20): 10:00–13:30, lunch break, 14:30–18:00.

- Hitote (2 arrows per participant first check) followed by individual corrections,
- Kihontai (basic postures and movements),
- Shaho-Shagi no Kihon (fundamentals of shooting),
- Shitsu (dealing with errors: dropping a bow, an arrow, breaking a string),

Baltic Taikai

Saturday (October 19) 10:00 (*schedule will be provided after the registration*).

Event: Kinteki (distance 28 m), Kasumi Mato (target 36 cm), Zasha (kneeling form).

Categories: Team (3 archers) and Individual.

Order of shooting: Kyogi Maai for the Team Taikai and Shinsa Maai for the Individual Taikai.

Scoring: Tekichusei (accuracy system) – decision based on the number of hits.

Tied score: Izume (hit/miss) will be used to decide 1st place, Enkin (closest to the center) will be used to decide other cases.

Awards: both Team and Individual 1st, 2nd and 3rd places will receive Medals and Diplomas. Both Team and Individual 1st place will hold a Trophy.

Format for the Team Taikai

36 arrows per team (3 rounds Yotsuya (4 arrows) – 12 arrows per archer). Team with the highest score will win.

Individual archers without a team and reserve archers will be grouped by three to participate as a mixed teams.

Format for the Individual Taikai

The best 16 individual scores from the Team Taikai will continue in Elimination Tournament with Hitote (2 arrows) per round. Haya counts more than Otoyua. If both did not hit, Izume (hit/miss) will be used to decide winner.

Lithuanian Kyudo Championships (only for Lithuanians)

The best 3 individual scores from the Team Taikai will receive Medals and Diplomas.
The best individual score from the Team Taikai will receive Champion Cup and Diploma.
Best overall performance will receive Style Prize and Diploma.

Equipment and clothing must follow the accepted requirement ANKF Rules of Competition.

Participation fee 90 EUR. **Baltic Taikai only – 40 EUR.**

Lunch can be ordered at site on the expenses by participants.

Accommodation self-arranged by participants.
